Did You Know?

NICE Evidence Search is a Google-style search engine giving you access to accredited evidence in health, social care and public health. You can do a simple search and find guidelines, systematic reviews, evidence summaries and patient information. There's no need to log in. Content is refreshed regularly and up to date. Full text of the search results can be freely obtained in most cases.

You can also access the British National Formulary, British National Formulary for Children and Clinical Knowledge Summaries. Evidence is included from the Scottish Intercollegiate Guidelines Network (SIGN), the Cochrane Library, Royal Colleges, Social Care Online and GOV.UK.

New PubMed link for Education Centre Library

Do you use PubMed?

We now have a dedicated link from the *PubMed* Medline database to Education Centre's online journals. *PubMed* comprises more than 25 million citations for biomedical literature from MEDLINE, life science journals, and online books. The new link is now on the Resources Access column on the [Library Website](#).

If you see the symbol: click on the link to access the full-text article through ECL. Links are usually in the top right-hand corner.



Other links may indicate free access but this is not guaranteed. If a cost is indicated go to our [article request](#) form and we will obtain the article from another library. Articles cost £2.00 each to supply. It will certainly be much cheaper than ordering the article through the journal website.

Trip have just released a significant new upgrade to the site. It is now even better at helping users find evidence-based content. *Highlights of the site include:*

- Better design, based on careful analysis of how users interact with the site.
- New content types: 'Regulatory guidance' and 'Ongoing systematic reviews' (via PROSPERO).
- A lovely new responsive site making Trip easy to use on smart-phones and tablets.
